

## Сборник вопросов по Официальным правилам баскетбола (на английском языке) к семинарам для судей и комиссаров

1.	B3 enters the restricted area before the ball has left A4 hands on the last free throw. The ball touches the ring but does not enter the basket. The game shall be resumed with a jump ball situation.
2.	If an injured player cannot continue to play immediately (within approximately 15 seconds), he must be substituted unless the team is reduced to less than 5 players on the playing court.
3.	A4 accidentally scores the 2-point field goal in his team's basket and is fouled by B4 in the act of shooting. Team B captain on the playing court shall be awarded 2 points.
4.	A team loses the game by forfeit if 1 hour after the scheduled starting time of the game the team is unable to field 5 players ready to play.
5.	Once the ball has become live on the 1st free throw, that penalty can no longer be used for cancelling any remaining penalties.
6.	After the beginning of the game, the scorer notifies a referee that A1 on the playing court is not the one indicated as starting 5 players. The error shall be disregarded and the game shall continue.
7.	A4 is awarded 2 free throws. A4 1st free throw is successful. A4 has the ball in his hands for the 2nd free throw when coach A commits a technical foul. A4 shall attempt the 2nd free throw with no line-up. Any team B player is awarded 1 free throw and the game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the centre line extended, opposite the scorer's table.
8.	A1 alternating possession throw-in lodges between the ring and the backboard. Team B shall be entitled to the alternating possession throw-in at the next jump ball situation.
9.	Player-head coach commits his 2nd unsportsmanlike foul and is disqualified. Player-head coach may remain in his team bench area and continue to act as the team head coach.
10.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball misses the ring after which a held ball is called. This is a held ball situation.
11.	A1 free-throw shooter commits a violation during his last free throw. The time-out can be granted to either team.
12.	During a half-time interval, A5 who has already committed his 5th foul commits a technical foul. The foul shall be considered as 1 of the team fouls in the 3rd quarter.
13.	A1 last free throw is in the air when A4 and B4 commit a double foul. The ball enters the basket. The game shall be resumed according to the alternating possession procedure.
14.	B4 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A5 dribbler. Before the ball becomes live for A5 1st free throw, A4 commits a technical foul. The 2 penalties cancel each other. The arrow favours team B. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in.
15.	Coach B requests a time-out shortly before A5 scores a field goal. The timer stops the game clock and attempts to notify an official of the time-out request. The officials cannot hear the signal because of an excessive noise. Following B1 first pass from the endline, A3 gains control of the ball on the playing court and scores a field goal. At this time, the time-out request is brought to the attention of the officials. The goal shall count.

16.	After the ball has left the hands of the crew chief on a toss for the jump ball, A1 jumper touches the ball for 3 consecutive times. A referee calls a violation. A6 requests a substitution for A1. A6's substitution shall be granted.
17.	During A1 backcourt thrown-in pass, B1 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball in the air and lands with the ball in his backcourt. This is a violation.
18.	A team which loses the game by forfeit shall receive 1 point in the classification.
19.	A shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball lodges between the ring and the backboard. Team B is entitled to a throw-in under the alternating possession procedure. The game shall be resumed with a team B alternating possession throw-in.
20.	The boundary lines are part of the playing court.
21.	A1 is wearing sufficiently padded protective equipment on the upper arm. He shall be permitted to participate in the game.
22.	The ball on A1 throw-in to A2 is in the air. Team A has control of the ball at this time.
23.	During a free throw, the ball becomes live when it is released on a shot for a free throw by the free-throw shooter.
24.	B3 commits an unsportsmanlike foul against A3, who is now injured and is replaced by A6. Any team A player, who was on the playing court at the time of the A3 injury may attempt the resulting free throws.
25.	A4 is holding the ball on the playing court close to the sideline. B4 who is closely guarding A4 has one foot out-of-bounds. In pivoting, A4 body touches B4 body. This is A4 violation.
26.	A1 thrower-in hands the ball over the boundary line so that the ball is above the playing court. B1 grabs or taps the ball out of A1's hands without any physical contact with A1. B1 shall be charged with a technical foul.
27.	The assistant coach has committed his 2nd technical foul. The assistant coach shall be disqualified.
28.	B1 fouls A1 on the shot for a 3-point goal. While the ball is on the downward flight, B2 commits a goaltending violation. A1 shall be awarded 3 points. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from behind the endline.
29.	A1 dribbles when B3 fouls A3. This is team B 2nd foul in the quarter. A2 and B2 then commit a double foul. This is a jump ball situation.
30.	The correctable error can be still corrected after the game clock signal sounded for the end the game, but before the crew chief has signed the scoresheet.
31.	A1 dribbles from his backcourt to the frontcourt and stops by straddling the centre line. While still dribbling, A1 taps the ball to A5 in the backcourt. This is a legal play.
32.	A3's shot for a goal in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball touches the backboard but neither touches the ring nor enters the basket. Team B does not gain an immediate and clear control of the ball. Team B shall be awarded a throw-in from behind its endline, but not directly from behind the backboard.
33.	B5 steals the ball and gains its new control in his frontcourt. The shot clock shall be reset to 14 seconds.
34.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when A2 and B2 commit a double foul. The ball enters the basket. This is a jump ball situation.
35.	During the 1st overtime, B1 fouls A1 dribbler. This is team B 6th foul in the 4th quarter and in the 1st overtime. A1 shall be awarded 2 free throws.
36.	A4 shot for a field goal is in the air when B5 fouls A5. This is team B 3rd foul in the quarter. The ball enters the basket. The goal shall count and the game shall be resumed with team A throw-in.

37.	With 10 minutes before the start of the game, a technical foul is charged against B5 who is not listed as 1 of team B's 5 players to start the game. The foul shall be recorded against coach B.
38.	A1's alternating possession throw-in lodges between the ring and the backboard. Team B shall be automatically entitled to the alternating possession throw-in at the next jump ball situation.
39.	At approximately same time, A1 commits a personal foul and B1 commits a disqualifying foul. This is a double foul.
40.	The first quarter shall start when the crew chief enters the centre circle to administer the jump ball.
41.	A1 and B1 begin a fight on the playing court. The officials decided that A1 shall be charged with a disqualifying foul, entered as D <sub>2</sub> and B1 shall be charged with an unsportsmanlike foul, entered as U <sub>2</sub> .
42.	B4 fouls A4 in the act of shooting. This is team B 4th foul in the quarter. An official places the ball at A4 disposal for the 1st free throw. The timer shall now position the team foul marker on the table.
43.	After having signed the column 'Captain's signature in case of protest', the team has 1 hour after the end of the game to submit the protest reasons in writing.
44.	A1 jumper touches the ball and then the ball touches the floor. B1 jumper now catches the ball and starts dribbling. This is a legal play by B1.
45.	A4 and B4 on the rebound catch the ball simultaneously, return to the floor holding the ball firmly with B4 one foot out-of-bounds. This is the out-of-bounds violation.
46.	A1 and B1 begin a fight on the playing court. A1 and B1 are disqualified, entered on the scoresheet as D <sub>c</sub> . Both disqualifying fouls penalties shall cancel each other.
47.	With 4 seconds on the shot clock, A1 dribbles in the frontcourt when A2 is injured and the game is stopped. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in from the frontcourt. The shot clock shall remain on 4 seconds.
48.	With 15 seconds before the crew chief is ready to toss the ball for the starting jump ball, a technical foul is charged against A4 who is still sitting on the team bench. The foul shall be recorded against coach A.
49.	A3 thrower-in with the ball in his hands moves backwards 4-5 meters and then passes the ball on the playing court. This is legal.
50.	B1 establishes an initial legal guarding position. A1 jumps towards the basket. The direct path between A1 take-off and landing place is not occupied by B1 at the time of A1 take-off. B1 moves laterally and A1 contact on B1 torso occurs. B1 shall be charged with a defensive foul.
51.	At the end of the game, the scorer must enter at the designated place at the bottom of the scoresheet the time when the crew chief has signed the scoresheet.
52.	A5 commits a technical foul for throwing the ball against B4 face. B4 must attempt the free throw.
53.	A1 scores a goal after which the net turns over the ring. A referee stops the game to have the net adjusted. Only team B may substitute at this time.
54.	With 16 seconds on the shot clock, A1 dribbles in his frontcourt when the game is stopped by an official to search for B1 lost contact lenses. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in in its frontcourt. Team A shall have 16 seconds on the shot clock.
55.	When a referee has blown his whistle while the ball was in flight on a shot for a field goal, no player shall touch the ball after it has touched the ring while it still has the possibility to enter the basket.
56.	A1 released the ball on a shot from the 2-point field goal area. The ball on its upward flight is legally touched by B1 who is in the team A 3-point field goal area. The ball enters the basket. Team A shall be awarded 2 points.

57.	A10 substitutes A5. Before the game clock has started again, A10 commits a technical foul. This is A10 5th foul. The only team A substitute available is A5. A5 shall be permitted to become a player.
58.	A1 dribbles in the fast break, with no defender between himself and the basket. B2 contacts A1 from behind. This is B2 unsportsmanlike foul on A1.
59.	A1 commits his 5th foul. Before the foul is reported to the scorer, A1 commits a technical foul. Coach A shall be charged with a technical foul, recorded as 'B'.
60.	A1 in his backcourt dribbles for 5 seconds. B1 straddling the centre line, taps the ball which goes out-of-bounds in team A`s backcourt. Team A shall have the new 8-second period to move the ball into its frontcourt.
61.	A4 is dribbling in his backcourt for 5 seconds and passes the ball to A5 in his frontcourt. B4 in his backcourt deflects the ball back to A4. A4 shall have only 3 seconds remaining to cause the ball to move into his frontcourt.
62.	B3 fouls A3 dribbler. This is team B 5th foul in the quarter. A3 then throws the ball from the short distance directly to B3 face. A3 shall be charged with a disqualifying foul. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the centre line extended, opposite the scorer`s table.
63.	A substitute becomes a player and a player becomes a substitute when the scorer sounds his signal for the substitution.
64.	A4 attempts a shot for a field goal from his backcourt. The ball touches and rebounds from the ring directly to A5 who is also in the backcourt. This is the team A backcourt violation.
65.	A1 receives a pass with the left foot on the court. A1 shall be entitled to jump off this foot and land on both feet simultaneously.
66.	A1 thrower-in without moving, bounces the ball which touches the playing court and A1 catches it again. This is legal.
67.	A1 penetrates towards the basket and while in the air, A1 makes an illegal contact with his leg on B1 who is in a legal guarding position with both feet inside the no-charge semi-circle area. This is A1 offensive foul.
68.	At least 40 minutes before the game is scheduled to begin, each head coach or his representative shall give the scorer a list with the names and corresponding numbers of the team members who are eligible to play in the game.
69.	A1 dribbles when A3 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on B3. B3 shall be awarded 2 free throws, followed by a team B throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt.
70.	With 5 seconds remaining on the shot clock, A1 thrower-in passes the ball towards the basket where it touches the ring. The shot clock shall not be reset as the game clock did not start yet.
71.	A2`s shot for a goal is the air when a referee blows the whistle. The ball rebounds from the ring when A4 touches the ball. This is an interference violation by A4.
72.	If a player is shooting from the floor, the act of shooting ends when the ball leaves his hands.
73.	Instead of team A, a throw-in has erroneously awarded to team B. The game starts and the error is recognised before the next dead ball. The error shall be corrected.
74.	A4 thrower-in in his backcourt passes the ball to A5 in the frontcourt. A5 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball and lands in the backcourt with the ball in his hands. This is legal.
75.	The 2 team A accompanying delegation members are disqualified for leaving the team bench area during the fight on the playing court. Their disqualifications shall be entered on the scoresheet on the team A head coach with B2.

76.	With 0.00.2 second remaining on the game clock, team A is awarded a throw-in. Team A may score a goal only if the throw-in pass is tapped to the basket or directly dunked.
77.	B1 fouls A1. This is team B 3rd foul in the quarter. Later (not at approximately the same time), A1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on B1. B1 shall be awarded 2 free throws and the game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt.
78.	The ball enters the basket on a free throw. The ball becomes dead at this time.
79.	With 3 seconds remaining on the game clock in the 2nd quarter, A4 is erroneously awarded a throw-in, instead of 2 free throws. The error is recognised during the half-time interval. A4 shall be awarded 2 free throws before the game shall be resumed for the 3rd quarter.
80.	B4 fouls A4 dribbler. This is team B 5th foul in the quarter. Team A is erroneously awarded a throw-in, instead of 2 free throws. A5 thrower-in pass to A4 is tapped out-of-bounds by B5. Coach A requests a time-out during which the error recognized. A4 shall be awarded 2 free throws. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in.
81.	During a jump ball, neither jumper may tap the ball more than twice until it has touched one of the non-jumpers or the floor.
82.	A substitute becomes a player and a player becomes a substitute when the official beckons the substitute to enter the playing court.
83.	A2 enters the restricted area from his rebound place before the ball is released on A1 last free throw. The free throw is unsuccessful. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the free-throw line extended.
84.	A1 scores a field goal. Before the ball becomes live, B1 pushes A2. B1 shall be charged with a technical foul.
85.	A1 in his backcourt passes the ball towards the frontcourt. The ball bounces and rolls on the floor in the frontcourt without any player touching the ball. The 8-second count expires. This is an 8-second violation.
86.	During a time-out, A8 reports to the scorer as a substitute. A8 becomes a player when the time-out has ended.
87.	Team A accompanying delegation member is disqualified for leaving the team bench area and the active involvement in the fight on the court. Any team B member shall attempt 2 free throws with no line-up. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the throw-in line in the frontcourt.
88.	A2 alternating possession thrower-in commits a 5-second violation. The possession arrow is changed to favour team B. After team B throw-in, team B shall be still entitled to a throw-in at the next jump ball situation.
89.	Team A player commits a technical foul during the pre-game warm-up with 5 minutes before the start of the game. Coach A did not indicate him as 1 of the starting 5 players. The technical foul shall count as one of the team fouls in the 1st quarter.
90.	A4 penetrates towards the basket in his act of shooting. Instead of completing the shot, A4 passes the ball to A5 who is standing in the corner of the playing court. A4 then charges into B4 who is inside the semi-circle area. A4 shall be charged with an offensive foul.
91.	A screener may move laterally or backwards without being responsible for the contact.
92.	The referees shall not blow their whistles after a successful field goal.
93.	A4 is fouled in the act of shooting. The ball does not enter the basket. A4 then commits a technical foul. This is A4 5th foul and he must leave the game. Coach A

	shall designate the new free-throws shooter (instead of A4) from amongst the players who were on the playing court when the foul on A4 occurred.
94.	The ball has left the shooter's hands when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball become dead at this time.
95.	A1 holds the ball in his frontcourt near the centre line and is closely guarded by B3 and B5. A1 takes one step back and touches the centre line. This is a backcourt violation.
96.	During the game, the shot clock error has been corrected by the officials. Team B is convinced that they have been negatively affected and shall have the right to sign the scoresheet in the column 'Captain's signature in case of protest'.
97.	A4 in the act of shooting is fouled by B4. After the foul the game clock signal sounds for the end the quarter. A4 releases the ball in a continuous motion and the ball enters the basket. The goal does not count and A4 is awarded two free throws.
98.	With 20 seconds on the shot clock, A1`s shot for a field goal rebounds from the ring. A2 gains control of the ball in his backcourt. The shot clock shall be reset to 14 seconds for team A.
99.	B4 fouls A4 in the act of shooting. Coach B commits a technical foul. Instead of A4, it is A5 who scores all 3 free throws. The error is recognised before the ball has left A1 thrower-in hands from the endline. A5 1st successful free throw counts. A5 last 2 free throws shall be cancelled and the game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the free-throw line extended.
100.	A4 passes the ball to A5. A5 and B5 jump, catch the ball simultaneously, return to the floor holding the ball firmly with A5 one foot on the sideline. This is jump ball situation.
101.	A1 is in the restricted area for 2.5 seconds and receives a pass. A1 starts a dribble and releases the ball for a shot after 4 seconds passed. This is a 3-second violation by A1.
102.	A4 is awarded 1 free throw. After an official has stepped into the restricted area to administer the free throw, but before the ball is placed at the B4 disposal, team B request a time-out. The time-out be granted.
103.	A5 is awarded 1 free throw. Team B head coach instructs the players not to occupy the free-throw rebound places. Team B head coach shall be charged with a technical foul.
104.	B1 fouls A1 shooter. After that, B2 fouls A1. The official becomes uncertain if this B2 was correctly called as a personal foul and whether it shall be upgraded to an unsportsmanlike foul. The officials decided use the IRS review. When doing so, the officials realised that B2 contact on A1 can be called as an unsportsmanlike foul. The crew chief has upgraded B2 personal foul to an unsportsmanlike foul. This is correct.
105.	A1 fumbles the ball after the end of his dribble. A1 catches up to the ball and resumes the dribble. This is legal.
106.	A1 is in the act of shooting for a 2-point field goal when B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1. The ball enters the basket. The goal shall count and A1 shall be awarded 2 free throws, followed by a team A throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt.
107.	A1 attempts a jump shot. While in the air, B1 takes a position directly under A1. A1 returns to the floor and contacts B1. This is A1 offensive foul.
108.	During a half-time interval, A8 must request the substitution at the scorer's table and must report it also to a referee.
109.	When the shot clock is stopped and sounds, the game clock continues and may be stopped, if necessary, manually.

110.	A1 scores a last free throw. Team B is granted a time-out. Following the time-out, B4 thrower-in with the ball in his hands runs along the endline and passes the ball to B5 who is also out-of-bounds behind the endline. B5 then passes the ball on the playing court. This is legal.
111.	B4 has established an initial legal guarding position in front of A4. A4 jumps for a shot for a field goal. B4 jumps vertically with his arms extended directly above him. In releasing the ball, A4 arm movement causes contact with B4 arms. This is B4 defensive foul.
112.	B1 blocks A1`s shot for a field goal on its upward flight. A2 catches the ball in the air and attempts a shot for a field goal. While the ball is in the air, the shot clock signal sounds. The ball enters the basket. A2`s goal shall count.
113.	During the time-out, any person permitted to sit on the team bench may enter the playing court provided they remain within the vicinity of their team bench area.
114.	A4 from his backcourt passes the ball to A5 in his frontcourt. The ball touches the leg of an official who is straddling the centre line. The ball returns back to A4 still in his backcourt. This is a backcourt violation.
115.	During a throw-in, the ball becomes live when it is placed at the disposal of the thrower-in.
116.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball lodges between the ring and the backboard. The possession arrow favours team A. This is a shot clock violation and team B shall be awarded a throw-in.
117.	A4 is awarded 2 free throws. A5 attempts the free throws. A5 first free throw is successful. The error is recognised at this time. An official cancels A5 first successful free throw and cancels also the second free throw. The game shall be resumed with team B throw-in from the free-throw line extended.
118.	Instead of team A, a throw-in is erroneously awarded to team B. The game resumes and the error is recognised before the next dead ball. The error shall be corrected.
119.	A4 alternating possession thrower-in has the ball at his disposal when coach A commits a technical foul. Team B shall be entitled to the next alternating possession throw-in.
120.	A1 thrower-in behind the sideline places the ball on the floor. A2 on the playing court goes out-of-bounds, takes the ball and executes the throw-in. This is legal.
121.	A4 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. An official erroneously blows his whistle. The ball touches the ring. This is a jump ball situation.
122.	During a situation on the playing court which may lead to the fight, A6 and A7 leave the team bench area. Team A head coach shall be charged with 2 technical fouls, recorded as 'B'.
123.	An unsportsmanlike foul shall always involve a player contact foul with an opponent.
124.	B3 commits a contact disqualifying foul. Any team A player shall attempt 2 free throws.
125.	A1 is awarded 2 free throws. After the 1st free throw, A2 and B2 commit a double foul. A1 shall attempt the 2nd free throw and the game shall be resumed as after any last free throw.
126.	With 1:25 remaining on the game clock in the 4th quarter, A1 dribbles in his frontcourt. The ball is tapped by B1 into team A backcourt, where B2 fouls A2 with 8 seconds remaining on the shot clock. This is team B 2nd foul in the quarter. Team A is granted a time-out. After the time-out, coach A has decided for a throw-in to be administered from the throw-in line in its frontcourt. The shot clock shall be reset to 14 seconds.
127.	The player's disqualifying foul counts as one of the team fouls.

128.	A1 airborne shooter releases the ball on the shot for a field goal. A1 returns to the floor with one foot when fouled by B1. B1 foul is committed during A1 act of shooting.
129.	During a time-out, A6 requests a substitution. A6 becomes a player as soon as the time-out has ended.
130.	A4 scores a goal, after which the ball rolls off the court into the spectators' area. A referee stops the game. A10 requests the substitution. A10's substitution shall be granted.
131.	A1 dribbles in its backcourt for 5 seconds when A6 and B6 are disqualified for entering the court in a fighting situation. The foul penalties cancel each other. Team A is granted a time-out. Team A shall resume the game with a throw-in from its backcourt.
132.	A1 falls on the playing court, catches the ball and slides 1 m before he stops. This is a travelling violation by A1.
133.	There must be 14 seats available in the team bench area.
134.	A1 is setting a screen on B1. A1 must face B1 for a screen to be considered legal.
135.	A1 thrower-in straddles the centre line to start the 2nd quarter and passes the ball to A2. A2 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball in the air and lands with both feet in his backcourt. This is legal.
136.	The no-charge semi-circle lines are part of the no-charge semi-circle areas.
137.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when at approximately the same time A1 and B1 contact each other. A1 is charged with an unsportsmanlike foul on B1 and B1 is charged with a disqualifying contact foul on A1. The ball enters the basket. Team A has 2 team fouls and team B has 6 team fouls in the quarter. This is a double foul.
138.	Before A4 thrower-in has the ball in the hands to start the 4th quarter, B2 and A2 commit the technical fouls. The 4th quarter shall be still resumed with a team A throw-in.
139.	Interference violation occurs only when a defensive player touches the basket (ring or net) while the ball is within the basket.
140.	A4 commits his 5th foul. A4 is not informed that he must leave the game. A4 remains in the game and is later fouled in his act of shooting for a 2-point field goal. The ball does not enter the basket. At this time, A4 illegal participation is discovered. A4 shall attempt 2 throws to which he is entitled before leaving the game.
141.	A3 in his frontcourt passes the ball to A5 also in the frontcourt. On the pass, the ball is simultaneously touched by A1 and B1. The ball goes then into the team A backcourt, where the ball is first touched by A2. This is a backcourt violation.
142.	A captain (CAP) has signed the scoresheet in the column 'Captain's signature in case of protest'. The crew chief, the umpires and the table officials must remain in the building until the crew chief gives them the permission to leave.
143.	A7 is disqualified for entering the playing court during a situation which may lead to a fight. A7 disqualifying foul shall count as one of the team fouls.
144.	A1 is dribbling in his backcourt, steps on the centre line and touches the frontcourt. A1 continues to dribble in the backcourt. This is a backcourt violation.
145.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the game clock signal sounds for the end of the 1st quarter. Immediately after, B4 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1. B4 foul shall be disregarded.
146.	The 2 team A accompanying delegation members are disqualified for leaving the team bench area and their active involvement during the fight on the playing court. Their disqualifications shall be entered on the scoresheet on the team A head coach with B <sub>2</sub> , B, B.



147.	On a neutral court, the choice of team benches and/or baskets is decided by a draw.
148.	If a scorekeeping error is recognised on the scoresheet after the end of the playing time and before the scoresheet has been signed by the crew chief, the error shall be corrected, even if this correction influences the final result of the game.
149.	Once the ball has become live on the first free throw, that penalty can no longer be used for cancelling any remaining penalties.
150.	The thrower-in can run along the endline whenever the throw-in is administered from the endline
151.	An official calls an offensive foul on B4. Team B is convinced that the call should have been a defensive foul on A3. After the game, team B may file a protest against the given decision. This is correct.
152.	Team B is entitled to a throw-in under the alternating possession procedure. A referee and/or a scorer makes an error and the throw-in is erroneously awarded to team A. After the ball touches or is legally touched by a player on the court, the error can be corrected. As the result of the error, team B shall not lose its right to the next alternating possession throw-in at the next jump ball situation.
153.	During his backcourt throw-in, A1 passes the ball to A2 who jumps from his frontcourt. A2 catches the ball in the air and lands in his backcourt. This is a backcourt violation.
154.	The crew chief shall be authorised to use the approved technical equipment to decide whether the successful shot for a field goal at the end of a quarter was released during playing time.
155.	A4 in his backcourt is dribbling for 5 seconds. B4 with one foot in his backcourt, touches the ball which goes out-of-bounds at team A backcourt. Team A shall have 3 seconds to move the ball into its frontcourt.
156.	B1 is charged with a technical foul. A6 enters the game and attempts a free throw.
157.	A2 is fouled and appears to be injured. Coach A comes on to the playing court but A2 insists he is able to continue playing. A2 must be substituted.
158.	The substitution for both teams is permitted whenever the game clock is stopped.
159.	The scorer shall notify the teams and the referees at least 3 minutes before the 3rd quarter is to begin.
160.	A1 is in the act of shooting for a 3-point field goal when B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1. The ball does not enter the basket. A1 shall be awarded 3 free throws, followed by a team A throw-in from the throw-in line from its frontcourt.
161.	Neither team has the control of the ball when B1 commits a technical foul. Before the ball becomes live for team A free throw, A1 commits a technical foul. The equal penalties cancel each other. The arrow favours team B. The game shall be resumed with a team B alternating possession throw-in.
162.	The shot clock shall not be reset when the same team that previously had control of the ball is awarded a throw-in, as the result of a cancellation of equal penalties against both teams.
163.	With 0:45 remaining on the game clock in the 4th quarter, A1 dribbles in his frontcourt when B1 taps the ball to team A backcourt where A2 starts to dribble. B2 now taps the ball out-of-bounds in the team A backcourt with 6 seconds remaining on the shot clock. Team A is granted a time-out. Coach A has the right to decide whether the game shall be resumed with a throw-in from the throw-in line at the team's frontcourt or from the team's backcourt. If from the frontcourt, team A shall have 14 seconds on the shot clock.
164.	Any contact foul called during a dead ball period must be considered as an unsportsmanlike foul.

165.	During an interval of play between the 1st and 2nd quarter, B6 disrespectfully addresses an official. Coach B shall be charged with a technical foul recorded as 'B'.
166.	A1 is awarded a throw-in, instead of 2 free throws. A1 thrower-in passes the ball on the playing court to A2 who scores a field goal. Before the ball becomes live again, the error is recognised. The error shall be corrected.
167.	The basket in the frontcourt is part of the frontcourt.
168.	B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1 in his successful shot for a field goal. A1 then commits a technical foul. The goal shall count. B1 unsportsmanlike and A1 technical foul penalties cancel each other. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt.
169.	The Crew Chief will always be the administering referee for the throw-in opposite-side to start the quarters.
170.	A4 shot for a field goal is in the air when A5 and B5 commit a double foul. The ball enters the basket. The goal shall count and the game shall be resumed according to the alternation possession procedure.
171.	After an opening jump ball, A5 gains control of the ball on the playing court. Almost immediately A2 and B2 commit a double foul. The game shall be resumed with a new jump ball.
172.	A2 jumps from out-of-bounds without the ball. A2 receives A3's pass and lands with both feet on the court. This is a violation by A2.
173.	A1 rebounds the ball and swings his elbows excessively without any contact with B2. A1 is charged with a technical foul.
174.	A1 pass to A2 is deflected by B1 with a fist. This is a legal play.
175.	With 0:58 on the game clock in the 4th quarter, team A scores a goal. Team B is granted a substitution, after which team A head coach requests a time-out. The time-out shall be granted.
176.	A1 captain commits his 5th foul and becomes an excluded player. Later at the game, coach A is disqualified. Team A does not have an assistant coach. A1 shall replace the coach.
177.	During a throw-in or during a free throw, regardless whether the game clock is stopped or not, in the judgement an official a player deliberately delays the process of taking the ball. It is a correct procedure for an official to place the ball on the floor in this time.
178.	A1 is dribbling in his backcourt for 6 seconds when B1 deliberately contacts the ball with his foot. Team A shall have only 2 seconds remaining to cause the ball to go into its frontcourt.
179.	A4 thrower-in holds a ball in his hands at his endline when A5 remains for more than 3 seconds in that restricted area. This is a 3-second violation by A5.
180.	A1 in the air receives a pass. He lands on the floor and losing his balance with the ball in his both hands, the ball touches the floor. Keeping his pivot foot on the same place, he bends-up and starts a dribble. This is legal.
181.	A4 thrower-in in his backcourt passes the ball to A5 in the frontcourt. B5 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball in the air and lands in the backcourt. This is legal.
182.	A5 is dribbling and the ball bounces very high. A5 takes two steps while pushing the ball to the floor on the continuous dribble. At no time the ball came to rest in A5 hands. This is a violation.
183.	A1 scores a field goal. B2 thrower-in passes the ball on his backcourt. After few seconds and with team B still in the backcourt, an official recognised that the shot clock has not started yet. The game shall be resumed with a team B backcourt

	throw-in from the place nearest to where the ball was located when the game was interrupted. Team B shall have a new 8-second period.
184.	With 0:28 on the game clock in the 4th quarter, A1 thrower-in is closely guarded by B1. A1 requests a referee for a permission to move 2 meters along the boundary line before releasing the ball. A1`s request shall be granted.
185.	A1 dribbles in his backcourt when a double foul is called in his frontcourt. The throw-in shall be administered from the place nearest to where the ball was when the double foul was called, that is in the backcourt.
186.	A2 has ended his dribble. A2 passes the ball to A3. B4 blocks the pass and the ball returns to A2 directly (without touching the floor). A2 starts a new dribble. This is legal.
187.	Only the team A first assistant coach is disqualified for leaving the team bench area and his active involvement in the fight on the playing court. The team A first assistant coach`s disqualification shall be entered on the scoresheet on the team A head coach with B <sub>2</sub> and on the team A first assistant coach with D <sub>2</sub> , F, F.
188.	The thrower-in may move laterally 1m in one direction, return to the original place and then move 1m laterally in the opposite direction. This is legal.
189.	A4 and B4 enter the restricted area before the ball has left A2 hands on the last free throw. The goal shall count.
190.	During a fight, an assistant coach may leave the team bench area to help restoring order.
191.	With 1:23 on the game clock in the 4th quarter, team A is awarded a throw-in from its backcourt when a referee stops the game to clean the floor. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in from the centre line extended, opposite the scorer`s table.
192.	The ball has been legally tapped on the jump ball. A2 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball in the air and before landing on the playing court, passes the ball to A1 jumper who has not yet left the centre circle in the backcourt. This is a legal play.
193.	The crew chief enters the centre circle to administer the opening jump ball between A1 and B1. After the ball is tossed but before it is legally tapped, B2 pushes A2. B2 shall be charged with a personal foul.
194.	A3 is setting a screen outside the field of vision of B2 stationary on the playing court. A3 must permit B2 to take 1 normal step towards the screen, without making contact.
195.	A2 is fouled and appears to be injured. Coach A comes on to the playing court but A2 insists he is able to continue playing. A2 must be substituted.
196.	B1 is charged with an unsportsmanlike foul on A1 for hitting him with his elbow. The officials decided to use the IRS to review B1 foul. When doing so, the officials realised that no contact has occurred. The foul shall be downgraded to a technical foul. This is correct.
197.	With 7:22 on the game clock in the third quarter, B1 fouls dribbler A1. This is the second team B foul in the quarter. The team A head coach believes that there was no legitimate attempt to play the ball and that B1`s personal foul should be upgraded to an unsportsmanlike foul. The team A head coach requests an HCC, using the proper procedure. This is correct.
198.	After the game has started, an official discovers that both teams are playing in the wrong direction. The game shall be stopped and the baskets exchanged.
199.	A1 scores a field goal or last free throw, Team B is granted a time-out. Following the time-out, B3 thrower-in places the ball on the floor after which B2 takes the ball. This is legal.

200.	In a case of the fight, the officials can use the IRS without making a decision before using the IRS.
201.	With 7 seconds on the shot clock, A4 dribbles in his frontcourt when a double foul between A1 and B1 in the frontcourt occurs. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in and with 24 seconds on the shot clock.
202.	A1 disrespectfully communicates with an official after the game clock signal has sounded for the end of the 4th quarter. The game ends with score A70 - B76. A1 is charged with a technical foul.
203.	With 5:28 on the game clock in the second quarter, A1 dribbles close to the sideline and passes the ball to A2 who scores a goal. The team B head coach believes that team A has committed a clear 8-second violation before A2 scored the goal. The team B head coach requests an HCC, using the proper procedure. This is correct.
204.	With 0:44 remaining on the game clock in the 4th quarter, A1 thrower-in has the ball in his hands when B1 making no effort to play the ball commits a foul on A2. This is B1 unsportsmanlike foul.
205.	During a half-time interval, A5 who has already committed his 5th foul commits a technical foul. The foul shall be considered as 1 of the team fouls in the 3rd period.
206.	Team A is granted time-out. While moving to his team bench, A1 pushes B1. A1 shall be charged with a technical foul.
207.	A1 accidentally causes the ball to pass through the basket from below. This is a jump ball situation.
208.	When guarding a player without the ball, the "elements of time and distance" shall apply.
209.	A3 commits a 3-second violation after which A2 and B2 commit technical fouls. The arrow favours team A. The game shall be resumed with a team A alternating possession throw-in.
210.	Team A has been in control of the ball for 15 seconds. A1 passes the ball to A2 and the ball moves across the boundary line. B1 is trying to save the ball from going out-of-bounds and jumps from the playing court over the boundary line. B1 still in the air taps the ball by one hand and the ball returns to the playing court where it is caught by A2. Team A remains in control of the ball.
211.	The opinion of the commissioner shall decide when the officials disagree.
212.	With 4:16 on the game clock in the third quarter, A1 drives to the basket and scores a goal. The team B head coach believes that there was a clear travelling violation by A1 before the goal was scored. The team B head coach requests an HCC, using the proper procedure. The team B HCC shall not be granted.
213.	A3 thrower-in has the ball in the hands when A4 fouls B4. This is team A 5th foul in the quarter. B4 shall be awarded 2 free throws.
214.	A1 pass from his backcourt touches an official who is straddling the centre line. Team A has caused the ball to come to its frontcourt.
215.	During the pre-game warm-up, A1 and B1 commit the technical fouls. The technical foul penalties cancel each other. The game shall begin with a jump ball.
216.	A1 is dribbling in his backcourt for 4 seconds when B1 taps the ball which goes out-of-bounds in team A backcourt. Team A shall have 4 seconds to move the ball into the frontcourt.
217.	A1 dribbles when A2 hits B2 with the elbow. The referees do not call a foul against A2. After another 5 seconds B3 fouls dribbler A1. This is the fifth team B foul in the quarter. The IRS review can be used to identify, at any time during the game, the involvement of the team members during any act of violence.

218.	With 10 seconds remaining on the shot clock, A1 dribbles when a held ball is called. The arrows favors team A. The shot clock shall be reset to 14 seconds for team A.
219.	A3 is disqualified for fighting on the playing court. A technical foul shall be entered in the scoresheet against coach A.
220.	With 4 seconds remaining on the shot clock, team A has control of the ball in its frontcourt. B1 is injured. An official interrupts the game. The game shall be resumed with team A throw-in and the shot clock shall be reset to 14 seconds.
221.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball touches the backboard but misses the ring. The ball rolls on the floor. It is touched by B1 followed by A2 and it is finally controlled by B2. The game shall continue.
222.	A5 commits his 5th foul and must leave the game. A5 then commits a technical foul. A5 technical foul shall count as one of the team fouls.
223.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball misses the ring. The ball touches B1 and it goes out-of-bounds. Team A shall be awarded a throw-in.
224.	B2 commits a double dribble violation. Before the ball is awarded to A3 thrower-in, A5 commits a technical foul. This is a team control foul.
225.	B1 fouls dribbler A1. The referees become uncertain whether B1's foul shall be upgraded to an unsportsmanlike foul. The IRS review can't be used to decide, at any time of the game, whether a personal foul shall be upgraded to an unsportsmanlike foul.
226.	A1 shot for a field goal is in the air when the shot clock signal sounds. The ball bounces from the ring with still the possibility to enter the basket. B1 taps the ball away. This is an interference violation.
227.	A1 commits a double dribble violation, immediately followed by B1 foul. This is team B 3rd team foul in the quarter. This is a jump ball situation.
228.	The lines inside limiting the restricted area are part of the restricted area.
229.	The scorer shall effect substitutions.
230.	With 3:43 on the game clock in the second quarter, A1 attempts a successful shot for a 3-point goal. The referees become uncertain whether the ball was released from the 2- or 3- point goal area after the ball is live for the team B throw-in after the goal, when B2 is fouled in the act of shooting by A2 and after the ball is live for B2's first or only free throw. The review shall be conducted at any time of the game.
231.	The ball touches the back of the backboard. The ball has gone out-of-bounds.
232.	The scorer shall prepare the scoresheet at least 40 minutes before the game is scheduled to begin.
233.	A1 throw-in lodges between the ring and the backboard. This is a jump ball situation.
234.	A1 shot for a field goal lodges between the ring and the backboard with 4 seconds on the shot clock. Team A is entitled to the alternating possession throw-in. After the throw-in, team A shall have a new 14 second period.
235.	A6 requests a substitution for A1 free-throw shooter. A1 violates on his last free throw. The substitution shall be granted.
236.	A3 thrower-in steps on the court when passing the ball on the playing court. A throw-in violation is called. Team A is still considered to be in control of the ball after the whistle has been blown.
237.	With 2.5 seconds on the game clock, A1 attempts a shot for a goal. The ball touches the ring, B1 rebounds it and starts a dribble. At this time, the game clock signal sounds for the end of the game. The referees become uncertain whether B1

	stepped out-of-bounds when landing with the rebounded ball on the court. The IRS review can be used.
238.	A1 commits his 5th personal foul. Team A has now only 1 player entitled to play. In the judgement of an official, team A has still an opportunity to win the game. Team A shall be allowed to continue playing with 1 player only.
239.	Before either team has established the control of the ball during an opening jump ball between A1 and B1, the non-jumpers A2 and B2 commit a double foul. The game shall be resumed with a new jump ball between A2 and B2.
240.	A1 scores a field goal. A3 and B3 then commit the technical fouls. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the endline.
241.	A4 dribbles along the endline and jumps backwards from behind the backboard. A4 charges into B4 who is in a legal guarding position inside the no-charge semi-circle area. A4 shall be charged with an offensive foul.
242.	On the opening jump ball, both teams face each other in the wrong directions. The game begins and A5 scores 2 points when the error is discovered. The 2 points scored by A5 shall be credited to the team B captain.
243.	If the injured player receives treatment, he must be substituted unless the team is reduced to fewer than 5 players on the playing court.
244.	During the jump ball, the game clock shall start when the ball becomes live.
245.	Team A scores a field goal. B1 thrower-in bounce-passes the ball to B2 who is also standing behind the endline. B2 then passes the ball on the court to B3. This is a legal play.
246.	The crew chief may overrule a decision made by the umpire(s), if he feels it is important.
247.	The player's technical foul counts as one of the team fouls.
248.	B4 commits a disqualifying contact foul on A4. A4 must leave the game because of injury. A10 enters the game to replace A4. Any team A player may attempt 2 free throws.
249.	A1 is awarded 1 free throw. Team A is now granted a time-out, after which A2 scores the free throw awarded to A1. The error is recognised during the 1st dead ball after the game has resumed. The official cancels 1 point scored by A2. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the place nearest to where the game was stopped to correct the error.
250.	The team B head coach requests an HCC. The head coach establishes visual contact with the nearest referee and says loudly in English «challenge», but shows the signal for the IRS review, rotating the hand with a horizontal extended index finger. The team B HCC shall not be granted.
251.	B2 moves on the court. A3 screener must apply the "elements of time and distance".
252.	A1 is in the act of shooting with the ball still in his hands when A4 commits a foul on B4. A1 releases the ball in the continuous motion. The ball enters the basket. The ball becomes dead when the foul occurred.
253.	During a throw-in that starts the 2nd quarter but before the throw-in has ended, a foul is committed. The foul occurred during the 2nd quarter.
254.	B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1 during his unsuccessful 2-point shot for a field goal. A1 shall be awarded 2 free throws. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in at the place nearest to where the foul occurred.
255.	During a last free throw, the players behind the free-throw line extended and behind the 3-point field goal line may enter these areas after the ball has been released by the free-throw shooter.

256.	B1 distracts by shouting loudly to A1 on his unsuccessful shot for a field goal. An official warns B1 and informs coach B that if the similar behaviour shall be repeated, B1 shall be charged with the technical foul.
257.	Action Area involves only players with the ball.
258.	During a time-out, A6 request a substitution to the scorer and returns to his team bench. When the game resumes, A6 comes directly on the court as one of 5 players. This is the correct substitution procedure.
259.	It is not important that a referee move to be in the right position to see the gap.
260.	A1 throw-in from the endline goes out-of-bounds at the opposite endline of the playing court without being touched by a player on the playing court. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the endline where the ball went out-of-bounds.
261.	After having signed the column 'Captain's signature in case of protest', the team has 1 hour after the end of game to submit the protest reasons in writing.
262.	A1 in his backcourt is dribbling for 5 seconds. A held ball is called. Team A is entitled to the next alternating possession throw-in. Team A shall have the new 8-second period to move the ball into its frontcourt.
263.	Thrower-in A1 is straddling the centre line to start the 2nd quarter. A1 makes one normal lateral step towards the frontcourt. A1 passes the ball to A2 who is in the backcourt. This is a team A backcourt violation.
264.	A1 in the 3-point field goal area passes the ball to A5. The ball enters the basket without being touched by any player. A1 shall be awarded 3 points.
265.	B1 has established his initial legal guarding position. B1 may move laterally into the path of A1 dribbler without taking the time or distance into consideration.
266.	A1 jumper touches the ball and after that the ball touches the floor. B1 jumper now catches the ball and starts dribbling. This is legal.
267.	Team A wears shirts that have a different colours on the front and on the back. Team A shirts are legal.
268.	Team B player commits a technical foul during an interval of play before the 1st quarter. Any team A player shall be awarded 1 free throw before the jump ball. When the ball becomes live for the free throw, the alternating possession arrow shall be reset to indicate that team B shall be entitled to the ball at the next jump ball situation.
269.	With 15 seconds remaining on the shot clock, A5 shot for a field goal is in the air. The ball lodges between the ring and the backboard. The possession arrow favours team B. The shot clock shall be reset to 24 seconds.
270.	A1 is wearing a metal brace on his finger. The brace is completely covered with soft padding. It is legal to wear such equipment.
271.	A1 has ended his dribble and releases the ball on a shot for a field goal. The ball misses the ring and it is not touched by any player. A1 catches the ball again and starts a dribble. This is a violation.
272.	Each disqualification for fighting of an accompanying delegation member shall be charged on the head coach, entered as circled B <sub>2</sub> but shall not count to the 3 technical fouls for his disqualification.
273.	A3 deliberately scores a goal in own basket. A3 shall be charged with a technical foul.
274.	A1 thrower-in passes the ball to A2. A2 receives the ball with one foot touching the boundary line. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the place of the original throw-in.
275.	A4 fouls B4. This is team A 4th foul in the quarter. The scorer shall position the team foul marker on the scorer's table immediately after an official completed the reporting of the foul to the scorer's table.

276.	A team which loses the game by default shall receive 1 point in the classification.
277.	A4's last free throw is successful. Before the ball becomes live, A5 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on B4. Team A head coach now requests a time-out. The time-out shall be delayed until B4 completed his free throws.
278.	A1 penetrates towards the basket and while in the air, A1 makes an illegal contact with his leg on B1 who is in a legal guarding position with one foot inside the no-charge semi-circle area. This is A1 offensive foul.
279.	A1 is injured. Team A first assistant coach enters the playing court and A1 recovers within 15 seconds. A1 shall be substituted.
280.	A1 in his backcourt passes the ball to A2 in his frontcourt. B1 jumps from his frontcourt, catches the ball in the air and lands straddling the centre line. B1 then passes the ball to B2 in his backcourt. This is legal.
281.	A1 releases the ball on the shot for a field goal. Returning on the floor, A1 charges into B1 who is in a legal guarding position. An official calls a foul on A1. This is a team control foul as A1 is still in the act of shooting when the contact occurs.
282.	B1 deliberately blocks A1 pass to A2 with his upper leg. This is a legal play.
283.	A1 thrower-in hands the ball over the boundary line so that the ball is above the playing court. B1 grabs or taps the ball out of A1 hands without any physical contact against A1. B1 shall be charged with a technical foul.
284.	B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1. Coach A and coach B then commit the technical fouls. The technical fouls cancel each other. A1 shall be awarded 2 free throws. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt.
285.	A1 is charged with an unsportsmanlike foul against B1 during the interval of play between the first and second quarter. Before the start of the second quarter, B1 shall attempt 2 free throws with no line-up. The game shall be resumed with a team B throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt. Team B shall have 14 seconds on the shot clock. The direction of the alternating possession arrow shall remain unchanged.
286.	B1 violates before the ball is tapped on the initial jump ball. Either team can now substitute.
287.	A maximum of 8 accompanying delegation members (including 2 assistant coaches) may sit on the team bench.
288.	B3 commits an unsportsmanlike foul against A4 in the act of shooting for a 2-point goal. The ball does not enter the basket. A4 then commits an unsportsmanlike foul against B3. The 2 unsportsmanlike foul penalties cancel each other. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in from the place nearest to where the first unsportsmanlike foul was called.
289.	A1 scores a field goal or a last free throw. Team B is granted a time-out. Following the time-out, B1 thrower-in places the ball on the floor after which B2, also behind the endline, takes the ball. This is legal.
290.	A1 in his backcourt near the centre line bounce-passes the ball to A2 who is also in the backcourt near the centre line. On the pass, the ball touches the frontcourt before touching A2. This is a backcourt violation.
291.	A3 and B5 are holding the ball firmly in team A frontcourt. A3 now steps back to his backcourt. This is a jump ball situation.
292.	A1 in the act of shooting for a 2-point field goal is fouled by B2. A1 still in the air is then fouled by B1. The ball does not enter the basket. A1 shall be awarded 4 free throws.
293.	Before the game, both head coaches agree that team A shall have the team bench to the right of the scorer's table as well as to warm-up at the basket to the right of the scorer's table. Their request shall be granted.



294.	A4 shot for a field goal is in the air when A5 and B5 commit a double foul. The ball enters the basket. The possession arrow favours team A. The game shall be resumed with a team A throw-in according to the alternating possession procedure.
295.	A1 shot for a field goal is legally blocked by B1. The shot clock signal sounds after which B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1. A1 shall be awarded 2 free throws, followed by team A throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt, Team A shall have 14 seconds on the shot clock.
296.	The crew chief has the power to make decisions on any point not specifically covered by the rules.
297.	The players are allowed to warm-up during the interval of play between the 1st and 2nd quarter.
298.	A1 thrower-in without moving, bounces the ball out-of-bounds and catches it again. This is legal.
299.	B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A1 in his successful 3-point field goal. A1 now commits a technical foul. The equal penalties shall be cancelled. A1 goal counts and team B shall be awarded a throw-in from the endline.
300.	Simultaneously with the game clock signal for the end of the 1st quarter, B1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul against A1. Before the start of the 2nd quarter, A1 attempts 2 free throws with no line-up. The arrow favours team A. The 2nd quarter shall start with a team A throw-in from the throw-in line in its frontcourt. The arrow shall be reversed.
